Dear Ms. Kitchings:

Pursuant to Rule 208(b)(7), SCACR, I am notifying the Court of the following supplemental citations:

- (1) State v. Garrett, 305 S.C. 203, 206, 406 S.E.2d 910, 911-12 (Ct. App. 1991) (“A motion to quash an indictment addresses only the sufficiency of the indictment, not the sufficiency of the State's evidence. . . Garrett has not claimed, either in the circuit court or in this Court, that the indictment in question is not sufficient on its face. His exception seems to be based on a misunderstanding of the function of a motion to quash. The exception is wholly without merit.”) (citations omitted), *overruled in part on other grounds by State v. Ramsey*, 311 S.C. 555, 430 S.E.2d 511 (1993).
- (2) Segars–Andrews v. Judicial Merit Selection Com'n, 387 S.C. 109, 124, 691 S.E.2d 453, 461 (2010) (“The powers conferred and the duties to be discharged with regard to a public office must be defined, directly or impliedly, by the legislature or through legislative authority.”) (citation omitted).
- (3) S.C. Code § 24-1-20 through 140 (dealing with the creation of the Department of Corrections);
- (4) S.C. Code § 16-23-415 (making it a crime to take a weapon from a law enforcement officer or corrections officer);
- (5) 2 S.C. Code Ann. Regs 38-007(B)(2) & 38-013(C)(2) (2011) (dealing with basic law enforcement certification for correctional officers with the Department of Corrections); and
- (6) S.C. Code § 9-11-10 (23)(B) (defining correctional officers as “police officers” for purposes of joining the Police Officers Retirement System).
