Thank you for the listing of the requirements for Transcript Ordering and Initial Brief submittal, that was contained in your August 29, 2014 letter.

I will serve the Appellants' Initial Brief today, and I believe compliance with the filing deadlines of Rule 207 is intact, there was a deviation in communications:

The Notice of Appeal was served on 7/19/2014. On 7/28/2014, I informed the Court Reporter, Joy Holston, that I wished to order the transcript. Ms. Holston replied on 7/29 that she would prepare the transcript, send it to me, and provide cost details, (copy of applicable emails are attached). I believe this is suitable evidence that the transcript ordering occurred during the required 10 days.
