

ORDER

Because Appellant failed to serve the notice of appeal on the State within thirty days as required by Rule 203(b)(2), we dismiss the appeal as untimely. *See Mears v. Mears*, 287 S.C. 168, 169, 337 S.E.2d 206, 207 (1985) (explaining the notice of appeal is a jurisdictional requirement, and the appellate courts have no authority to extend the time in which the notice of intent to appeal must be served); Rule 263(b), SCACR ("The time prescribed by these Rules for performing any act except the time for serving the notice of appeal under Rules 203 and 243 may be extended . . ."). The remittitur will be sent as required by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
