MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Ronald Lee Legg respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days, **until October 22, 2014**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Ronald Lee Legg respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time.




6. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.


