
Thank you for talking with me earlier today regarding the above referenced case. Pursuant to our conversation, you indicated a letter requesting an initial extension would be sufficient in lieu of a formal motion (although the \$25 motion fee will be paid). As mentioned, Trey DesChamps, the attorney of record for the Appellant, and my colleague, recently had a baby girl delivered via an emergency c-section operation on his wife. I primarily practice real estate transactions and am solely assisting Trey in obtaining an extension to file a reply brief in the above referenced case.
