MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Darrell Williams respectfully requests a **final thirty (30) day extension, until November 28, 2014**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel two previous extensions.

Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. Roderick Pope with the Court of Appeals on September 2, 2014. Counsel filed


the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Israel Colecio v. State of South Carolina with this Court on August 28, 2014.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request as shown by signature below.




