**MOTION FOR THIRD EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH

I.

II.

Pursuant to RE: Extension Requests in Criminal Direct Appeals and Post-Conviction Relief Certiorari Proceedings: Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009, the State moves for a **third** extension in the above-referenced criminal appeal and asks for an additional thirty days to complete the brief in this case. McMillan, and State v. Scott, has submitted a Brief of Petitioner to the Supreme Court in State v. Jenkins, has submitted a Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari to the Supreme Court in State v. Peters, State v. Ivery, and State v. Bishop, and has submitted a Return to Petition for Rehearing to this Court in State v. Pope and State v. Crosby.

This extension request is not intended for purposes of delay, but rather to ensure that the Brief is properly researched and prepared. The Brief in the above case has required substantial research because the case involves a significant evidentiary issue on appeal. The undersigned is currently working on the Brief in this case and hopes to have it completed in a timely manner. WHEREFORE, Respondent prays that the Court extend the deadline for the service and filing of the Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter in this case for thirty (30) days from the date such relief is granted; and for such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.


