MOTION FOR AN  
EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO FILE BRIEF

I, the appellant in this case filed the first and only motion for extension for more time to file the initial brief.

This court filed an order dated October 29, 2014 giving me until November 10, 2014 to file the initial brief and designation of matter.

For the reasons below, I request for another extension of time from this court:

1. I filed a motion, the only motion in this case so far, with this court on 10/13/14 - requesting an extension of time to prepare the initial brief. I still needed to Shepardize a few authorities and cases and the brief was not ready;
2. My dorm, Edisto, is allowed to go to the law library only on Thursdays from 6:45 a.m. until 10:10 a.m., unless an inmate has a thirty-day deadline which would allow access Monday through Friday from 6:45 a.m. until 10:10 a.m.

3. Since requesting more time, Filed on 10/13/14, I have not had a deadline, limiting my access to the courts / the law library to Thursdays only, 6:45am until 10:10am.
4. There have been four Thursdays since 10/13/14.
5. October 16, 2014 and October 23rd and 30th, 2014, as well as November 6th 2014.
6. Thursday, October 16, 2014: Although I requested, the inmate that signs other inmates on the law library list neglects to sign me up, preventing me from going.
7. Thursday, October 23, 2014: The entire institution was locked down for inspection and inventory - all areas were closed.
8. Thursday, October 23, 2014: An altercation between a group of inmates occurs in the sally port of Edisto unit (my dorm) preventing me from making the movement going out; I did speak and plead with the officer, but was still disallowed.
9. Thursday, November 6, 2014: An emergency situation occurred in Ashley dorm on Wednesday, November 5, 2014 requiring the Warden to lock the entire institution down for the days of November 5th and 6th of 2014.
10. I need to obtain access to the computer in the law library so as to finalize my initial brief.

11. I am requesting a thirty-day (30) extension of time to ensure the finalizing of my initial brief.
12. This Court gave an order granting appellate until November 10, 2014 to file his initial brief, however, appellate did not receive the order until November 4, 2014, due to a delay by SCDC although it was postmarked October 29, 2014.
13. The delay in receiving This Court's order and the situations out of appellant's control that have unfortunately prevented appellant access to the law library.

As a result, I, the Appellant, request a thirty-day extension of time.



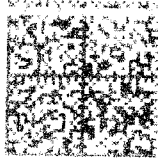
