ORDER

Appellant has filed a motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss the appeal or, alternatively, to deny Appellant's motion.

After careful consideration, this Court dismisses the appeal as not immediately appealable because the ALC's order is interlocutory and not a final decision. See S.C. Code Ann. § 1-23-610(A)(1) (Supp. 2013) (stating an aggrieved party may seek judicial review only from a *final* decision of the ALC); *Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hosp. Auth. v. S.C. Dep't of Health & Envtl. Control*, 387 S.C. 265, 267, 692 S.E.2d 894 (2010) ("If there is some further act which must be done by the court prior to a determination of the rights of the parties, the order is interlocutory. A judgment which determines the applicable law, but leaves open questions of fact, is not a final judgment." (internal citations omitted)).
