MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted

and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



On November 12, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Raymond Bradley McCarter v. State with this Court. On November 7, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Michael T. Sanders v. State with this Court. On November 5, 2014, counsel filed a brief of appellant and record on appeal in The Matter of the Care and Treatment of Andrew Goodwin with the Court of Appeals. On November 3, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Lavadre Butler v. State with this Court. On October 15, 2014, counsel filed a Memorandum in Support of a Motion for a New Trial in State v. Travoris Hurst with the Court of Appeals. On October 9, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Michael Daniels v. State with this Court. On October 7, 2014, counsel held an oral argument in State v. Damon T. Brown before the Court of Appeals. On October 3, 2014, counsel filed a brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Nicholas B. Glover with the Court of Appeals. On October 1, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in David Myers v. State with this Court.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances.



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
