Dear Sir:

Please excuse me if this letter conveys my contempt because of my having to point out what should be "obvious" in accordance with normal procedures.

This office itself, noticed that "a motion to relieve counsel was filed for at minimum, a 3rd time on 8/26/2014". And a hearing denying that motion was heard "in person", before Judge Verdin, at the Greenville County Courthouse, on September 5, 2014.

Your citation for returning "a immediate appeal" from a motion for relieving counsel is improper. As the Supreme Court "does not prohibit" such pro-se motions involving relieving counsel.

A appeal remains to petition for "counsel release", for reasons unjustified by the September 5, 2014 ruling by Judge Verdin. In a higher court. The defendant herein has a "Sixth Amendment right to (1) Choice of Counsel and (2) "Choosing himself as his own attorney in the pending criminal matters".


Clearly exposed on the first page of my motion sent to your office, exposed the evident basis of my motion. Motions to relieve counsel "is NOT"

restricted" by the Supreme Court directive. And any person assigned to screen filings in a Clerk of Court office, should have been aware of what a filing consist of prior to costing that person additional postage for resending motions that should have been filed the first time around.

In Conclusion, §14-3-330(2) authorized "according to statute", the right to file an immediate appeal from a denial of a pre-trial issue involving "Choice of Counsel". Divesting this Clerk's office of "subject-matter-jurisdiction, and conferring such to the court of appeals".

I suggest the file of the September 5, 2014 hearing, and the motions I filed "pro-se" be forwarded to Columbia. Because Columbia has certainly received a copy of the return dated September 17, 2014, from this office.
