ORDER

Respondent filed a motion to dismiss, contending the underlying order on appeal is not immediately appealable. Appellant filed a Return, and Respondent filed a Reply. After careful consideration, Respondent's motion to dismiss is granted. *See State v. Miller*, 289 S.C. 426, 346 S.E.2d 705 (1986) (holding a criminal defendant may not appeal until sentence is imposed); *State v. Hubbard*, 277 S.C. 568, 290 S.E.2d 817 (1982) (holding a denial of a motion to suppress evidence is not immediately appealable).
