On Jan. 24, 2013 I William T Watts II sent my appeal to the SC Court of Appeals, on Jan 28, 2013 I sent a Notice of Appeal to Lexington County Solicitor's office (205 E. Main St. Room 309, Lex., SC, 29072), Lexington County Clerk of Court (205 E. Main St., Lex., SC, 29072), Richland County Clerk of Court (1701 Main St., Colo., SC, 29201). I hoped that Judge Newman would receive my notice from Richland County's Clerk because Lexington County's Clerk was not filing my motions. I sent my lawsuit to the Supreme Court of South Carolina on Jan 30, 2013 (it was never filed), because Lexington County's Clerk was not filing my motions and I do not have enough paper to hand copy everything (the copies provided by Lexington County Detention Center (LCDC) were illegable). I left a voice mail message for my lawyer to file a Notice of Appeal on Jan. 28, 2013. On Jan. 31, 2013 I received a letter from the SC Court of Appeals stating that notice of appeal must come with proof of service as well as a copy of the order I am appealing. I believed that proof of service would be certified mail or served by a police officer. I asked officers at LCDC how I could send certified mail and attempted

to send the Solicitor and Lexington County Clerk of Court my Notice of Appeal by certified mail (return receipt, so I could send the receipt to the appeals court for proof of service), I also asked the Lexington County Clerk of Court for the order and a transcript of the hearing, forms needed to have my appeal served by police on Feb. 4, 2013. (CDC did not send my letters certified mail (the mail forms were returned to me and it was stated by McDaniel Supply Company that they did not have any letters with them.) I tried again, paper clipping the form to the letter, on Feb. 5, 2013, to send the Solicitor my Notice of Appeal by certified mail (I have never received a bill or the return receipt.) I don't believe it was sent certified mail.) Using my last stamped envelope I requested an additional 10 days from the SC Court of Appeals, sent on Feb. 5, 2013. On Feb. 7, 2013 I received a letter from Lexington County Clerk of Court stating that: they do not provide forms to have police serve papers, all motions have to be filed by my attorney, SC Administration Court provides transcripts and my Notice of Appeal had been forwarded to the Solicitor. I did not get the order from the hearing (I can not provide the order I am appealing, I can't get it.) This is the 1st time that Lexington County Clerk of Court has filed my motions (stamped filed without

a case number). I believe that the Supreme Court of South Carolina or the SC Court of Appeals asked Lexington County Clerk of Court to file my motions, I completed rewriting my motions: to remove my ineffective attorney, subpoena Lexington County Sheriff's Department (For x-ray images, audio and video, tracking data/locations, etc), a cease and desist order to stop the x-ray drone and rewriting my lawsuit (because the copy I have is illegable) on Feb. 14, 2013. I asked the correctional officer if he could increase the darkness setting to maximum and make 3 copies (93 total copies), he said that he knew how to do it, I gave him all my motions and lawsuit on Feb. 14, 2013 to get copies. As of Feb. 25, 2013 I have not gotten copies of the originals back, I went from illegable copies to losing everything just after Lexington County had to start filing my motions.

So far the people that have thrown away my motions, lawsuit or prayer for relief have the United States Supreme Court, District Court of South Carolina, South Carolina Supreme Court, Lexington County Court, Elizabeth Fullwood (my ineffective lawyer) and Lexington County Detention Center. I hoped I would be allowed to speak or file verbally

in court but that has not happened and if the Solicitor and Elizabeth Fullwood get their way I never will.

On Feb. 26, 2013 my motions and lawsuit were returned (no copies) I was told it was not legal papers and could not be copied. I do not have enough paper to hand copy them or enough to keep sending motions and appeals and proofs of service. I am indigent, I do not have money, I have to trade stamped envelopes to get paper, I am out of envelopes and afraid to use the large manilla envelopes because LCDC may say its not legal papers and not stamp them and send them.

Lexington County Sheriff's Department (LCSD) is using an x-ray drone (remote controlled plane) on me and everyone within 1/4 mile. X-ray are ionizing radiation (like microwave ovens), it hurts, I experience physical illnesses. Today Feb. 27, 2013, LCSD has x-rayed LCDC more than 300 times today, more than 29,000 times since Sept. 6, 2013 and more than 39,000 times total, the FBI and SC State Police have investigated LCSD and South Congaree Police Department (SCPD). I am filing my lawsuit and subpoena with Lexington County tomorrow Feb 28, 2013.

The Solicitor received the notice of appeal from Lexington County Clerk of Court, sending another notice with a proof of service, when I don't have enough paper, is a burden (I wish I had more paper and envelopes and copies) I can not get the order to send with the notice, I would send a copy of the request and response from Lexington County Clerk of Court but I can't get copies. I can appeal immediately because of the judge's and my lawyers conduct and LCSO's use of x-rays while in court (being searched and injured while being humiliated by the judge). This is historical South Carolina courtroom prejudice. My attorney is ineffective I NEVER wanted a mental evaluation, I feel like I have to say whatever makes SC Mental Health Department happy to move forward with my case, which will hurt my credibility.
