ORDER

Respondent filed a motion to compel Appellant to amend the record on appeal, asking that this Court require Appellant to include in the record all matters designated by Respondent. Appellant filed a return.

We grant Respondent's motion. *See generally State v. Hunter*, 82 S.C. 153, 155, 63 S.E. 685, 686 (1909) ("It is too obvious for argument that . . . the circuit court should take judicial notice of all orders of record made in the progress of the cause, including the remittitur from this court on appeal, and that the [appellate court] should take judicial notice of its own orders and decrees made in a former appeal in the same cause."). Within fifteen days, Appellant must serve an amended record on appeal that contains all items listed in both parties' designations of matter. Specifically, Appellant must include in the record the twenty-one items listed in Respondent's motion to compel. The parties must serve and file their final briefs within fifteen days of the service of the amended record.
