ORDER

On June 5, 2014, this court ordered Appellant to serve and file an amended record on appeal within thirty days that included sequential page numbers and redacted personal data identifiers and sensitive information pursuant to the Supreme Court of South Carolina's August 13, 2007 order. *See In Re: Interim Guidance Regarding Personal Data Identifiers & Other Sensitive Info. in Appellate Court Filings*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated Aug. 13, 2007, amended by *Revised Order Concerning Personal Identifying Info. and Other Sensitive Info. in Appellate Court Filings*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated April 15, 2014. Appellant served and filed an

amended record on appeal in July 2014. Respondent has filed a motion to correct the amended record on appeal, asserting it does not contain sequential page numbers or comply with the Supreme Court of South Carolina's April 15, 2014 Order. Specifically, Respondent asserts Appellate has redacted more information than is required by the April 15, 2014 order, including names of persons who are not minors and case names.

Respondent's motion is granted. Within thirty days, Appellant shall serve and file a second amended record on appeal that includes sequential page numbers and complies with the Supreme Court's April 14, 2014 order, which requires the following redactions:

1. Social Security Numbers, Taxpayer Identification Numbers, Driver's License Numbers, Passport Numbers or any Personal Identifying Numbers. If it is necessary to include personal identifying numbers in a document, the parties should utilize some other identifier. *Parties shall not include any portion of a social security number in a filing.*
2. Names of Minor Children. If a minor is the victim of a sexual assault or the victim in an abuse or neglect case, the minor's name must be completely redacted and a term such as "victim" or "child" should be used. In all other cases, the name and first initial of the last name (i.e., John S.), or only the minor's initials (i.e., J.S.) should be used.
3. Financial Account Numbers, including any type of Bank Account Numbers, Personal Identification Number (PIN) Code, or Passwords. If financial account numbers are relevant, only the last four digits of these numbers should be used.
4. Home Addresses of minors, sexual assault and abuse and neglect victims, and non-parties. If a home address of a minor, sexual assault victim, or non-party must be included, only the city and state should be used.

5. Date of Birth. If a date of birth must be included, only the year of birth should be included.

Revised Order Concerning Personal Identifying Info. and Other Sensitive Info. in Appellate Court Filings, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated April 15, 2014.

Failure to comply with this order may result in dismissal of this appeal. See Rule 260(a), SCACR (noting this court may dismiss an appeal for failure to comply with the requirements of the appellate court rules).
