MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Jonathan Finney respectfully requests a **fourth and final** extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:


2014. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Alfonzo Alexander with this Court on November 4, 2014.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.


