ORDER

Appellant appeals an order of the circuit court denying her motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*. The order specifies Appellant was the defendant in the underlying action.

This Court dismisses the appeal as not immediately appealable because the circuit court's order did not have the effect of discontinuing the action or preventing an appealable judgment. *See* S.C. Code Ann. § 14-3-330(2) (1977). This Court also finds the appeal is moot because, as the Georgetown County Public Index indicates, the circuit court has dismissed the underlying action without prejudice. *See Curtis v. State*, 345 S.C. 557, 567, 549 S.E.2d 591, 596 (2001) ("An appellate court will not pass on moot and academic questions or make an adjudication where there remains no actual controversy."); *Sloan v. Greenville Cnty.*, 380 S.C. 528, 535, 670 S.E.2d 663, 667 (Ct. App. 2009) ("Mootness also arises when some event occurs making it impossible for the reviewing court to grant effectual relief."). Accordingly, we dismiss this appeal.
