This matter is before the South Carolina Administrative Law Court (ALC or Court) pursuant to the Notice of Appeal filed by Appellant (Inmate) above named, who is incarcerated with the South Carolina Department of Corrections (SCDC). Inmate appeals from the decision in his Step 2 Grievance denying his allegations that Inmate was assaulted by officers. The Step 2 Grievance stated that “[t]he minimum amount of force was used to bring you into compliance as a result of your disruptive behavior.”

Inmate (a) was not sanctioned with the loss of any good time credits; (b) made no claim for the loss of any other state created liberty or property interest; and, (c) made no contention that his sentence, sentence related credits or custody status has been erroneously calculated. There is clearly no state created liberty interest implicated here.

Under Slezak v. S.C. Dep’t of Corr., 361 S.C. 327, 605 S.E.2d 506 (2004), the ALC is to have jurisdiction of all properly perfected inmate appeals but “Summary dismissal may be appropriate where the inmate’s grievance does not implicate a state created liberty or property interest.” Such is the case here.<sup>1</sup>

Therefore, for the foregoing reasons this case is hereby **DISMISSED, WITH PREJUDICE.**
