MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Counsel for Kathryn King respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days, **until March 30, 2015**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.






