ACTION REQUESTED: To have one room designated as unit rest room or to have doors opened during the hours of 0430 - 2300 daily.

INMATE'S REASON FOR APPEAL (state specific dissatisfaction): EVEN WITH DOORS LOCKED THERE WERE STILL BEEN FIGHTS AND STEALING. THERE EXISTS AN SERIOUS HEALTH CONDITION FOR BOTH STAFF AND INMATES ALIKE. YOU CAN'T STAY IN A ROOM 24 HRS A DAY AND NOT EAT, GET MEDICAL ATTENTION, OR SHOWER. WE STILL HAVE TO USE THE SHOWERS THAT THESE INMATES ARE USING FOR A RESTROOM. BY NOT DESIGNATING A SINGLE ROOM TO BE USED AS A RESTROOM FOR A WING A DANGEROUS HEALTH CONDITION IS BEING ADOPTED BY SCDC PERSONEL AND INMATES ARE BEING FORCED TO LIVE IN THESE CONDITIONS WITH NO REGARD FOR THE CONSEQUENCES OF THEIR ACTIONS. THERE ARE ROOMS ON EACH WING THAT COULD BE CONVERTED FOR THIS USE. MEASURES NEED TO BE TAKEN TO STOP THE UNSAFE CONDITIONS THAT INMATES ARE BEING SUBJECTED TO IN THE NAME OF SECURITY.


ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter is before the South Carolina Administrative Law Court (ALC or Court) pursuant to the Notice of Appeal filed by Appellant (Inmate) above named, who is incarcerated with the South Carolina Department of Corrections (SCDC).

Inmate appeals the decision of SCDC in a matter concerning the living conditions at SCDC. SCDC's decision indicates he was not sanctioned with the loss of any good time credits; Inmate made no claim for the loss of any other state created liberty or property interest; and, made no contention that his sentence, sentence related credits or custody status has been erroneously calculated. There is no state-created liberty interest in the loss of opportunity to earn additional good time credits. Howard v. SCDC, 399 S.C. 618, 733 S.E.2d 211 (2012).

Under Slezak v. S.C. Department of Corrections, 361 S.C. 327, 605 S.E.2d 506 (2004) the Administrative Law Court is to have jurisdiction of all properly perfected inmate appeals but "Summary dismissal may be appropriate where the inmate's grievance does not implicate a state created liberty or property interest." Such is the case here. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED, WITH PREJUDICE.**
