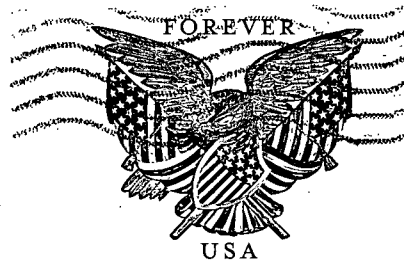

I've been incarcerated here in Berkeley County for close to 5 months and I'm ready to be released as soon as a bed opens for Drug Treatment which I hope to be on a waiting list any day now. So I hope this letter clears up any confusion or misunderstanding between myself and Debra Littlejohn I will send her a letter as well so she knows where I stand I've requested to see her several times since my court date and she has not come to visit me in jail since I saw her in court.
