



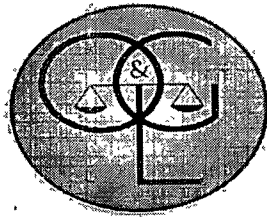

In regards to Appellate Case No. 2015-000436 The State v. Sean Osborne appellant states the following reasons for the purpose of this Court granting appeal from his plea agreement. 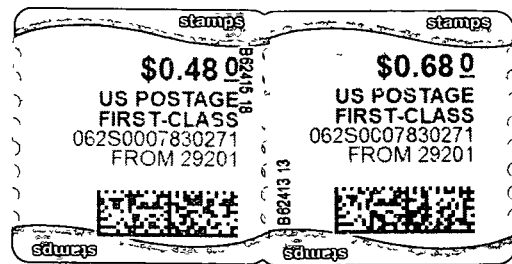
