MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted

and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

On March 23, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Jason Boney v. State with the Supreme Court. On March 20, 2015, counsel filed a petition for rehearing in State v. Jabbarie Brown with the Court of Appeals. On March 19, 2015, counsel filed a brief of appellant pursuant to *White v. State* in John G. Kimble v. State with the Supreme Court. On March 19, 2015, counsel filed a brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Michael D. Camp with the Court of Appeals. On March 11, 2015, counsel held an oral argument in State v. Michael C. Andes before the Court of Appeals. On March 9, 2015, counsel filed a brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Michael Hawkins with the Court of Appeals. On March 6, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Kenneth Henry Sherman v. State with the Supreme Court. On March 4, 2015, counsel held an oral argument in State v. Brittany Johnson before the Supreme Court. On March 2, 2015, Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in John Forest Ham, Jr. v. State with the Supreme Court. On February 26, 2015, counsel filed a brief of petitioner in West Webb Mitchum v. State with the Court of Appeals.


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload


