MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Counsel for Dider Sellner respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:



Counsel filed the reply to initial brief of respondent in the case of State v. Mandy Smith with the Court of Appeals on March 26, 2015. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Bill Breland with the Court of Appeals on March 6, 2015. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Jacqueline Bacon with the Court of Appeals on March 5, 2015.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. Counsel requests that time limits for filing the petition be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.




