MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF  
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel respectfully requests a **final extension of thirty (30) days until June 11, 2015**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



On May 6, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Elijah Baylock v. State with this Court. On May 1, 2015, counsel traveled to Aiken County for a hearing in State v. Barry Eugene Lafavor. On April 29, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Roshune Carelock v. State with this Court. On April 27, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Roger Raynard Parker v. State with this Court. On April 17, 2015, counsel a reply to return to petition for writ of certiorari in Luther Garner v. State with this Court. On April 15, 2015, counsel traveled to Beaufort County to participate in the reconstruction hearing in State v. Terrance Seabrook. On April 8, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Latisha Cochran v. State with this Court. On April 6, 2015, counsel filed an initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Samuel Robinson with the Court of Appeals. On April 2, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Richard Ratliff v. State with this Court. On March 27, 2015, counsel traveled to Beaufort County as part of preparation for the reconstruction hearing in State v. Terrance Seabrook. On March 26, 2015, counsel filed a brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Maurice Anthony Odom with the Court of Appeals. On March 16, 2015, counsel filed a brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Ricky Dale Pace with the Court of Appeals. On March 13, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in State v. Damon T. Brown with this Court. On March 12, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Daniel E. Dickson v. State with this Court. On March 3, 2015, counsel held an oral argument in State v. Daniel Lopez before the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request as shown by signature below.


