16. All evidence logs, items seized, etc.;


17. All NCIC reports, documents, papers, etc.;

My discovery from trial attorney Scott Robinson arrived at Lieber C.I. mailroom on 8/19/13. The entire discovery was seized by mailroom employee, Ms. Bryant. She informed me that the discovery would be sent to the Correspondence Review Committee (CRC) at SCDC Headquarters for censorship and editing. That discovery is pertinent to my appeal process at this immediate time. I have several conflicts of record, various meritorious issues, and other appeal/court issues and matters that are intimately involved with said discovery, some are time sensitive. I am now unable to perfect my appeal as a result of my legal discovery being confiscated. I'm writing to all applicable parties/courts to hold my appeals/matters in abeyance pending remedy of this grievance. As the SCDC General Counsel's Office and CRC are under the Attorney General's Office (AGO) I cannot disclose specific legal issues or matters. I have not waived any rights, especially attorney/client privilege. My attorney's (and therefore mine) workfile/casefile has been compromised and edited by my legal adversary. I also have sworn affidavits that Ms. Bryant mishandled the discovery, dropping papers from it, refusing to pick them up, and refusing to tape the box back up at my request, etc.

ACTION REQUESTED: That a coversheet/itemized checklist, including how many pages total (in number) have been left in the discovery, and how many pages total (in number) have been removed (taken), be prepared by the CRC and AGO and sent back along with the discovery. That I be allowed to verify the contents of the discovery upon re-arrival, before I sign for it (thus accepting it uncontested) and that the appropriate parties be present from the CRC and SCDC General Counsel's Office and the AGO when opened in my presence, to assure accuracy.

SPECIFY HOW AND WHEN INFORMAL RESOLUTION WAS ATTEMPTED BY GRIEVANT: By speaking with Ms. Bryant on 8/19/13 at the mailroom window. I asked her what Federal and/or State law(s) would allow my legal adversary to not only confiscate my entitled discovery, but to then remove papers from it. Immediately after speaking with Ms. Bryant I went to Major Nettles's office. I explained all of this to the Major. The discovery was brought into his office and looked through (in my presence). Major Nettles expressed that he saw no reason to confiscate the discovery. However, Ms. Bryant, who was within earshot, entered the office and said the discovery had to be confiscated, and thus it was.

Legal discovery, sensitive legal information, my case file and work file, all regarding Anderson County indictment Nos.: 2010-GS-04-00068 through 00073, that may never have been privy to the SC Attorney General's Office (AGO), is now under REVIEW by the SCDC Office of General Counsel, Correspondence Review Committee (CRC), a branch of the AGO. My entitled US Constitutional and SC Constitutional (Const.) protected legal mail/ discovery should never have been 1) seized, 2) taken out of my presence, 3) to be subjected to REVIEW and CENSORSHIP, 4) by my legal adversary, 5) violating many of my FEDERAL and STATE constitutional rights, etc.

Re: Informal resolution attempt-
An emergency grievance requires no informal resolution (IR) or else it would negate the factor of emergency. Also, the requirement of IR via request form to "prove" an IR is moot in this specific case as I tried to resolve this whole issue in the Major's office, with Major Nettles, Captain Sheppard, Lt. McGhee, and L. Bryant all present, within 10 minutes of the seizing of the discovery, well establishing an IR.

This discovery is almost certain to return before any non-emergency grievance procedure can get under way, what with all of the time consuming formalities. With this grievance I am attempting to have safeguards and precautions set in place when the discovery re-returns to Lieber from the CRC, which will help insure that the complete discovery is accounted for and that no pertinent papers are missing. This matter should be taken seriously by SCDC. The discovery should have been opened in a controlled environment in the first place, and not with me standing outside of the mail room where I can't possibly go through the over 1000-2000 pages or so.

This is all amplified by, because parts of this same discovery (in fact my whole legal box) was stolen/went missing as a result of my cell being purposefully left open, as the SCDC is well aware (see attached EMERGENCY GRIEVANCE to Ann Hallman; Officer Lineberry's Incident Report; and also pending grievance: LEECI-0464-13 at step 2 level [not attached]).


I have also attached the 10-6 form filled out by L. Bryant and also the affidavit of Levern McCrea, which further shows the mishandling of the discovery and the need to take steps to ensure that no further damage is sustained.

FURTHER ACTION REQUESTED: In addition to the initial grievance, LCI-1258-13 (attached), I also request to know all applicable FEDERAL and STATE laws, statutes, etc., and also all SCDC Policy that governs the seizing and editing of my legal mail/discovery.

Also that I be allowed to sign this grievance in person, as the attached initial does not bear my signature as I was never afforded an opportunity to sign.

If this EMERGENCY GRIEVANCE is not properly processed I will consider it

the agency's final decision regarding this grievance.

On August 19, 2013, Mr. Fullbrights' legal discovery was seized by a person named L. Bryant who works for your mailroom at Lieber Correctional. I would like to know what SCDC policy governs the seizing and review of an inmates' legal discovery. My personal information is in that legal discovery. This has been brought to my attention and I would like to know who, why, and what policy governs that my personal information is being put at risk, questioned, and reviewed.

Mr. Fullbright has been having his personal and legal mail tampered with in ways not allowed by SCDC policy. And now to learn that my personal information in his legal discovery is at the risk of being tampered with is unsettling to me. I question you as Warden as to how my information is being used and how do I now assume my personal information is safe. These grievances were deemed non-emergency in nature by Lieber Grievance Personnel, however any seizure of his legal discovery, again affects his ability to perfect his criminal appeal, which in effect deems this an emergency.

He needs your help and so do I in these matters. The entire contents of this letter rest upon your shoulders as Warden of Lieber Correctional Institution. I hope you take care of these issues to ensure that my personal information is kept safe and that all of Mr. Fullbrights' legal discovery is given back to him.



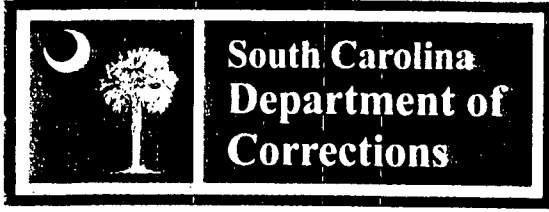



It's no secret, there's no privacy in prison. So, when Matthew Fullbright SCDC #349468 and myself requested Rule 5 legal discoveries from our respective attorneys, at different times, both of us encountering odd and unexplained problems with them, it was bound to be discussed between us. We have been roommates for the past four months or so. At all times in this affidavit Matthew Fullbright SCDC #349468 (hereafter "Cellmate") and myself have resided in Ashley Dorm, B Side, Cell 49 (AB-49).

My Cellmate received his Rule 5 legal discovery on 19 August 2013 at which time it was seized in its entirety and sent to SCDC's Correspondence Review Committee ("CRC") for review and censorship. As of today's date 24 September 2013, it is still at CRC and hasn't returned.

I received my requested Rule 5 legal discovery on July 30, 2013. Lieber mail room personnel L. Bryant flipped through it, in my presence, saw some evidentiary pictures within, and seized it in its entirety, sending it to CRC for review and censorship. The discovery re-returned from CRC on 21 August 2013 (hereafter "CRC Disc.") I quickly noticed many pages/papers missing (which I saw in it on 30 July 2013) and something other than the basic "review and censorship" had taken place by CRC. The CRC Disc. was now missing pictures, statements, attorney notes, etc. and also pertinent information such as Social Security numbers, names, and dates were marked out.

With no other means to obtain the missing pages/papers from CRC Disc. so I could later attach them to my PCR application, I wrote the Warden (McFadden), Lieber mail room personnel, my dorm Lieutenant, and others. I have never received a reply. So, with the PCR time still tolling and no remedy in sight, I re-wrote Mr. Walters (see attached letter to Mr. Walters dated 7 September 2013), and explained I needed him to re-send the same discovery minus the photos. He did so.

The Rule 5 legal discovery arrived today at my cell, AB-49, my Cellmate and I were both inside. Ofc. Ringold and Lt. Brown opened AB-49 around 10:40am, entered, called my name, stated I had legal mail, opened it in my presence, examined the Rule 5 legal discovery, thoroughly, stated that any photos would have to be removed, and had me sign for it. I asked them: "So, do you take out the photos or someone else?" They replied: "We take them with us now." And: "Well, looking

at these photos, only a map and a few face pics. and such, you can keep them." My Cellmate, witnessing this entire exchange is curious and asks: "What about the CRC and Social Security Numbers and such?" They replied: "What about them?" Cellmate: "It doesn't need to go to the CRC?" Them: "No."

The discovery I received today, 24 September 2013 (NON-CRC Disc.) was in fact full of pages/papers that were missing from the CRC Disc. upon re-return.

There are a few additional pages/papers which Mr. Walters must have inadvertently left out, but that is a matter I am to take up with Mr. Walters.

The issues I've laid out herein are that a) CRC did -in fact- remove pages/papers sensitive and pertinent to my appeal efforts both now and in the future; b) The unnecessary review and censoring of my Rule 5 legal discovery by CRC allowed tolling time to slip by, uncurable; c) There is no law, Federal, State, or otherwise, no SCDC policy(ies) that govern/give authority to CRC to treat my legal documentation as if it were a publication, some book, and remove the contents "they felt" should not be within, in apparent disregard to whether the "censored" contents are relevant/pertinent to my appeals process or not.

Now, my Cellmate and I have compared notes, documents, events, and other circumstances surrounding the seizing and alleged "censoring" of our discoveries and decided to draw up affidavits on behalf of ourselves as to the facts, so as to be relied upon to show proof, if later, litigation is involved with these discoveries.

Therefore, I write this. To this affidavit I have attached the following: 1) a copy of the envelope attached to CRC Disc., dated July 30, 2013 as "RECIEVED" and Aug. 21, 2013 as "Approved"; 2) A one page letter to Mr. Walters requesting my discovery dated 11 July 2013; 3) A one page letter to Mr. Walters dated 7 September 2013, re-requesting same discovery; 4) One page, "PROCEDURES FOR MAINTAINING CRIME SCENE PHOTOS AND/OR AUTOPSY PHOTOS", which was taped to the re-returned CRC Disc.

I altogether give this affidavit and all attached to my Cellmate, Matthew B. Fullbright, SCDC #349468, to use to corroborate or substantiate any allegations, issues, etc. he may raise or wishes to address, at all, in any proceeding, Court, setting, conversation, or in any way he deems fit and/or necessary concerning these matters or others.

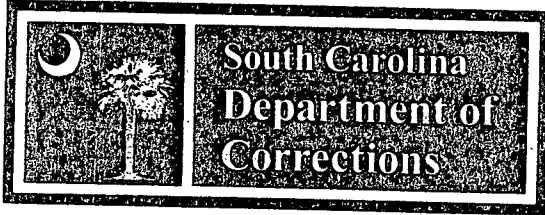

Dear Ms. Shearer:

Mr. David Tatarsky has received your letters regarding documents that were forwarded to the Correspondence Review Committee for review, and I am responding on his behalf. In your letter, you requested the policy/laws governing SCDC's actions, as well as details about Mr. Matthew Fullbright's legal mail. In regards to your personal information: if a committee member identifies personal information within an inmate's mail, such as a social security number, that information will be redacted. Other than the individuals who are tasked with reviewing the mail, Mr. Fullbright's legal mail will not be shared with other staff members nor will it be used by SCDC. Not only will Mr. Fullbright's legal mail not be shared with other Department staff, SCDC is not authorized to share Mr. Fullbright's legal information with you or other members of the public. As it relates to Mr. Fullbright's legal mail, the facts and holdings in Wolff v. McDonnell, 418 U.S. 539, 579, 94 S.Ct. 2963, 41 L.Ed.2d 935 (1974), support SCDC's actions. In Wolff, inmates challenged the inspection of their legal mail, specifically to and from attorneys, claiming the institution's policy permitting inspection of their legal mail was unconstitutional. The Court held that opening legal mail in the presence of the inmate does not amount to censorship and that opening the mail is justified to ensure the absence of contraband. Id., at 577, 94 S.Ct., at 2985.

You may also review the below listed SCDC policy and court cases which confirm SCDC has acted lawfully and within the authority and discretion given to it by the courts to limit and/or review an inmate's mail.

- Inmate correspondence (whether it is general mail, legal mail, or privileged mail) that is considered questionable by the mailroom staff will be forwarded to the Correspondence Review Committee (CRC) to be reviewed for compliance with policy. The correspondence can be read and/or scanned prior to receipt by the CRC if approval is given by the appropriate authority. SCDC Policy PS-10.08: Inmate Correspondence Privileges.
- Restrictions on the receipt of publications and photographs by inmates may be limited when the restriction reasonably relates to the legitimate penological interests of the institutions. Turner v. Safley, 482 U.S. 78, 89, 107 S.Ct. 2254, 96 L.Ed.2d 64 (1987).

- If an inmate's constitutional rights are not violated and the inmate's confinement comply with the terms of his/her sentence, "the Due Process Clause does not in itself subject an inmate's treatment by prison authorities to judicial oversight." Montanye v. Haymes, 427 U.S. 236, 242, 96 S.Ct. 2543, 49 L.Ed.2d 466 (1976).
- Prisoners do not hold a legitimate expectation of privacy. Hudson v. Palmer, 468 U.S. 517, 525, 104 S.Ct. 3194(1984) (quoting Smith v. Maryland, 442 U.S. 735, 740, 99 S.Ct. 2577, 61 L.Ed.2d 220 (1979)).

As aforementioned, SCDC has acted in accordance with the authority the courts have granted. Furthermore, the actions of our employees have been in compliance with SCDC policy. As an agency, we will continue to do what is necessary to maintain a safe and secure environment as it relates to the inmates in our custody.

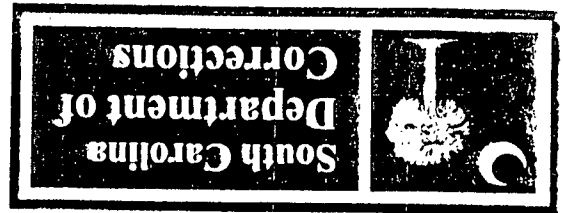

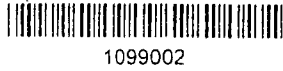

It contained Social Security Numbers, Dates of birth and other corresponding sensitive information, all of which was noted at the time it was inspected at the mail room window when I received it. * I have had several problems with outgoing/incoming legal effects since I have been here at Lieber such as: mail that goes missing, is delayed, legal mail opened outside of my presence, etc.

* There have been many times when my legal mail has been inspected and sensitive information has been noted by the mail room personnel, but is has never been seized so as to take out any sensitive information, that would be illegal.

* I have had major troubles with Ms. Bryant, a mail room employee at Lieber: she doesn't stick to policy, changes requirements from day to day, and seems to create frustration for inmate's attempts to access the Courts.

10/27/09 I was present on Olin Dr when Det. Beusse and Det. Collins interviewed Kenneth Burdette, but was called away before any written statement was taken.

10/27/09 I was advised to go to the Belton PD and offer any assistance needed pertaining to several cases they had pertaining to Fulbright. I was also advised to brief them on our interest in Fulbright and his possible connection tot his case. I, along with Det. Owens, met with Cpl Andy Smith and Steven Turner of the BPD. Turner was working a case where Fulbright was alleged to have stolen some property from his father Marshall Fulbright. Turner said that he had several contact with Marshall that day and that Marshall had confronted his son about it. Marshall told Turner that Matthew had agreed to meet him at home to return some property, but finding nobody home, Marshall entered the residence and looked for his son. Turner had lent Marshall a tape recorder in an attempt to gain a confession which he would turn over as evidence. Marshall contacted Turner and advised that he had found his son home and was just beginning to talk with him. Marshall asked for some time to speak with him, claiming that eh was messed up and needed to go to detox. A short time later, Turner contacted Marshall and Turner then went to speak with Matthew and gauge his level of intoxication (if any) and to further investigate his case. Turner returned later and said that Matthew had admitted to taking his father's property, but denied any other crimes. Turner said that Matthew did not seem under the influence of anything, but said that Marshall had inquired about taking him to detox and ANMED before bringing him tot the Belton PD to face charges, Turner agreed and allowed Marshall to check him in at the AAMC. I spoke with LT Major about these developments and it was decided to not approach Matthew while he was seeking treatment for possible drug use. Belton PD was to sign warrants the next day and planned on having Fulbright come turn himself in.

10/28/09 I went with Det. Beusse and Owens to the home of [redacted] to re-interview him after he had called Det. Beusse wishing to speak more about this case. During questioning [redacted] said that Fulbright had called him to pick him up on Friday night from a road off of hwy 413. When asked what road, he initially did not know the name but hat it began with "T" something. He said that the road off of 413 was only about a mile down 413 from Belton. I got my map from the car and red him the names of roads in the area that started with "T"- Tillotson, Triple, Turnston. None gained a reaction. I then read the names of several other streets in the area, mentioning Horton Last. I named Mayfield Heights, Jim Garrett, Mayfield School, George Bryant, then Horton. When I said Horton [redacted] turned suddenly as if surprised and reached out for the map. He said Horton was the road that he picked up Fulbright on. When asked why he had not mentioned this previously, he said that he had not remembered it. When asked what number Fulbright had called from, he claimed to not know. I asked if the number was in his phone and he handed it to me. I found no calls in the history though [redacted] claimed he had not erased any from the phone. He claims that Fulbright had borrowed his phone several times throughout the days he had known him and that he must have erased the numbers. He said that he had previously discussed going to hunt with Fulbright and said that after dropping him off at home, that he returned early to pick him up. He said that they went to Hardees then Wal-Mart where Fulbright purchased numerous

items. He showed us items in the bed of his truck which he said Fullbright had purchased at Wal-Mart including a ball cap, towel, bag, some food items and an open package of new socks. He did sign a consent to search of his truck, but it was decided to seize the truck on a search warrant and process it later. [redacted] agreed to ride with us and show us where he picked up Matthew on Horton and led us to the area between where the car was found and an unoccupied house on Horton. When he told me to stop, I got out and took photos from that location in several direction indicating where he claimed he had stopped. I noticed that from where he said he stopped, he was pointing directly at the drive where the car was located. We checked the area and did find a beer can on the ground which was photographed and taken as evidence. [redacted] then showed us to the area of Monitor Dr but initially we passed the place he had gone. He claimed to remember some things but not everything because of a past car accident which eh claims left him with a neurological condition. After driving several minutes on Dobbins Bridge Rd, we learned that Marshall Fullbright had property on Monitor below Nina Circle. Upon approaching it from the direction of Dobbins Bridge Rd, [redacted] directed us to a dirt drive beside a metal building and onto the far back of the property. We could only drive a portion of the way back because of mud and had to walk the rest. [redacted] pointed out an area beside a swap where he claimed that Fullbright burnt items while he [redacted] was in a tree stand hunting. He said that they came here right after going to Wal-Mart and the gas station next to Wal-Mart. [redacted] claims to not know what was being burnt, but said that Matthew had brought several bags from his house when they left to go hunting this date. He claims that eh got mad when he suddenly heard a "whoosh" and realized Matthew was burning something, mad because it was going to scare away any deer. He stated that Fullbright had broken his E-tool having apparently used it to dig or bury the burn pit. [redacted] claims to not know where the broken e-tool is now. [redacted] was provided lunch and asked to accompany us back to the ACSO to prepare a written statement, which he agreed to do. At the ACSO, Det. Hendrix sat in on the interview as his statement was prepared by me and Det. Beusse. As his statement was being prepared, I asked him why he had never asked what this was all about. His answer was just that he did not know, that he didn't have anything to do with anything and figured it was serious. He claimed to have just been trying to help Matthew out by letting him use his phone and by giving him a ride, still not asking what all this was about. I asked him to ask me what this was about and he did. I told him that a woman was missing and that her car was found on Horton Rd. Det. Beusse showed him photos of the car and told him that blood was found inside and that the male owner was dead. [redacted] asked "did he get shot or hit with a hammer?" Det. Beusse questioned him as to why he would ask that and why he thought it was a hammer. [redacted] said that he just assumed that it had to be either a gunshot or a hammer because of the amount of blood in the car. I also asked him if he saw anything else on Horton Rd when he picked up Matthew and he said that he did not. I asked if he recalled seeing a car on the side of the road and he said that he did not. I explained to him that where he stopped us today, he would have been looking directly at where the car was located and that if his headlights were on, he would have likely seen the taillights from the victim's vehicle. He again said that he did not remember seeing anything else. I pointed out that when we were on Horton Rd earlier, he recalled turning around in a driveway beyond the car drop site and said that he remembered doing so and seeing cars through the trees when he did, but I found it odd that he would not recall seeing this car when he stopped to pick up Matthew. He said that he had no explanation for that but again claimed that he could not remember a lot of things. [redacted] finished the statement and was transported home by Det. Campbell.

Responded to Anderson County Impound (Old Armory, Mall Road) on 093010 in reference to processing/searching the victim vehicle for bloodstain pattern analysis/reconstruction. Arrived on scene at 1149 hours. Vehicle was secured inside a bay. The vehicle was unlocked and the headliner had been removed. The headliner was leaning against a wall behind the vehicle. Investigators advised that the seats had been removed from the vehicle and were not reattached, but just sitting in the vehicle. Vehicle windows appeared to have been processed with BP. In meeting with investigators and Assistant Solicitor Huey, the main area of focus or question to be answered was if the crime had to have been committed by at least two people.

Vehicle information: Toyota Corolla, 4DR, SC BWF870, VIN: JTDBR32E270126671

Vehicle was photographed and searched.

The following was observed:

Driver side: Larger stains present in the driver front door threshold, consistent with drips.

-Appears to be a void on the right shoulder of the driver front seat. The blood flow on the same side is consistent with the seat being somewhat reclined at some point. Stain continues onto plastic hinge.

-Stains consistent with spatter are visible on the driver side mirror, which is consistent with the window being down during at least a portion of the incident.

Windshield: Stains consistent with spatter stains on the front windshield. Larger amount on the driver side. Stains mostly traveling towards the windshield as opposed to across the windshield. Per Supplemental DNA report, the stains collected were negative for blood.

Front: A large portion of the stains in the front of the vehicle (driver/passenger seats, console, dash) consistent with transfers, spurts, and flow on the seats. Stains directly behind the seats are consistent with flow from the front seats to the rear floor/hump and blood dripping into blood.

-All leather type surfaces appear to be heavily coated with some type of protecting product. Blood appears to have beaded up once coming into contact with these surfaces. When collecting samples, swabs also slid across these surfaces, which is also consistent with a protecting product.

Passenger side: Both passenger doors (front and rear) were open at some point during the incident, due to blood in the threshold of the doors. Stains are directional stains. Stains were visible in the original photographs of the front passenger door.

Please find enclosed Appellant's Record On Appeal.

This letter now informs This Court that the Respondent (SCDC) has again attempted to prevent a timely filing by Appellant; In this instance, this enclosed Record On Appeal ("ROA").

The Respondent has a habit of holding Appellant's legal mail (often for weeks) returning it to Appellant for frivolous, arbitrary reasons, after windows of service and timeliness have passed.

Appellant sent this same "ROA" to This Court back in February of this year. This Court returned the entire ROA back to Appellant accompanied with a letter dated March 05, 2015 explaining:

"The time has not expired for the respondent to file an initial brief and designation of matter."

By ORDER of This Court dated February 27, 2015: "[T]he respondent's initial brief and designation of matter are due within thirty days..." giving Respondent until March 29, 2015 to have a brief/designation filed.

On March 27, 2015 Respondent filed a motion to remand. Although not technically a motion for an extension of time, on page three Respondent asks This Court, if a brief is ordered to "grant twenty (20) days from the date of such an order to file its (Respondent's) brief."

The issue here is this:

1. According to Appellant's limited understanding of the Rules of Court, namely Rule 210(a), SCACR, "Within thirty (30) days after service of the last brief, the

appellant shall serve a copy of the Record on Appeal on each party who has served a brief. "

2. This Court Ordered Respondent to file a brief in reply by no later than March 29, 2015.

3. March 29, 2015 expired with Respondent having filed no brief, instead filing a motion to remand.

4. In Appellant's eyes, since Respondent chose to let the time prescribed by This Court expire without filing a brief, Appellant's time to file the ROA began on March 29, 2015, a deadline then dated April 28, 2015.

5. Appellant delivered the ROA to Lieber mail room staff on April 23, 2015 for mailing.

6. Without reason or explanation, said ROA was given back to Appellant during mail call on May 01, 2015.

7. It is beyond Appellant to predict what action This Court chooses to make, whether ordering Respondent to file a brief, hold Respondent defaulted, etc.


8. All Appellant has are the facts at hand are The Rules Of Court and the demands of This Court.

9. The facts here are that Respondent failed to file a brief in the time prescribed by This Court, making Appellant's brief the last brief filed, thus giving Appellant until April 28, 2015 to file the ROA.

10. Appellant did attempt to file said ROA by that date, only because of Respondent's actions in returning the ROA to Appellant, through no fault of Appellant's the ROA was not filed timely.

Appellant prays This Court, under the circumstances and according to the facts set out in this letter that this enclosed ROA is accepted as timely. The enclosed ROA is attached to the necessary certificates, etc.
