RULING ON APPELLANTS APPLICATION FOR AN INJUNCTIVE ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE WHY RESPONDENTS SHOULD NOT BE HELD IN CIVIL AND CRIMINAL CONTEMPT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CIVIL RIGHTS OF INSTITUTIONALIZED PERSONS ACT, (C R I P A), 42 U.S.C. § 1997 et. SEQ., SEC. 16-5-10.

NOW COMES APPELLANT, JOHN BACCUS, RESPECTFULLY TO DEMAND OF THE ABOVE COURTS, AND DECLARE SPEEDILY UNTO APPELLANT WHY RESPONDENTS SHOULD NOT BE HELD IN CIVIL AND CRIMINAL CONTEMPT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH (C R I P A), SECTION 16-5-10, AND DUE PROCESS CLAUSE VIOLATIONS BECAUSE CORRECTIONS OFFICERS DIRECTOR BRIAN P. STIRLING, L.C.I. WARDEN REYNOLDS INAPPROPRIATELY DEFERRED TO THE STATE COURTS OFFICERS NIKKI R. HALEY, RESPONDENTS REQUEST TO SECRETLY AND PRETEXTUALLY FOR DISCRIMINATORY REASONS, SYSTEMICALLY MAKE APPELLANT SUBJECT TO THE JURISDICTION OF S.C.D.C. AUTHORITIES AFTER TRIAL, INSTEAD OF MAKING INDEPENDENT DETERMINATION THAT [APPELLANT] IS LEGALLY COMMITTED TO THE INSTITUTION BASED UPON RESPONDENTS FACIALLY INVALID DATES, SIGNATURES, DUTIES, OBLIGATIONS PRESCRIPTIONS, APPEARING ON THE FACE OF THE COMMITMENT DOCUMENTS, I.E., C/N 2000-05-33-004 PURSUANT TO S.C.D.C. POLICY PROCEDURES NO. 21.09, HAVING THE FORCE AND EFFECT OF LAW, WARRANTS REVOCATION OF RESPONDENTS COMMITMENT ORDERS.

2.4 The R&E center can accept an inmate into the custody of the S.C.D.C. provided this inmate is received with a valid commitment order.

2.5 The R&E records section will make an initial determination based upon the commitment documents received from the county that an inmate has a valid South Carolina sentence to be served with the S.C.D.C.

2.6 If it is determined that required documents have not been received or that they are invalid, the inmate will not be accepted within the S.C.D.C.

6.3 Commitment Paper/NCIC/FBI reports

6.3.1 Compare commitment order for names, dates, addresses, signatures, indictment or warrant numbers, and special conditions indicated by the court.

6.3.2 Compare information on commitments with NCIC/FBI records compare information in the C.R.P. with committing documents. If entries (i.e. indictments numbers, warrant numbers, date of offenses, court dates, judges name) are found to be incorrect, adjustments will be made to remedy the problem.

11.4 A commitment order is a legal document issued by a judge or magistrate formally committing the defendant to the S.C.D.C. for a designated period of time (usually 90 day county clerk of court). This document is not annotated, which does not mean it is not a legal document. It is a legal document and must be signed, sealed, and filed in court.

Part Four Institutional Services

Section A Reception and Orientation

Principle: All incoming inmates undergo thorough screening and assessment at admission and receive thorough orientation to the institution's procedures, rules, programs, and services.

Admission

Written policies and procedures govern the admission of inmates new to the system. These procedures include at a minimum the following:

- determination that the inmate is legally committed to the institution
- thorough search of the individual and possessions
- disposition of personal property
- shower and hair care, if necessary
- issue of clean, laundered clothing as needed
- photographing and fingerprinting, including notation of identifying marks or other unusual physical characteristics
- medical, dental, and mental health screening
- assignment to housing unit
- recording basic personal data and information to be used for mail and visiting list
- explanation of mail and visiting procedures
- assistance to inmates in notifying their next of kin and families of admission
- assignment of registered number to the inmate
- giving written orientation materials to the inmate
- documentation of any reception and orientation procedure completed at a central reception facility

Comment:

Staff should explain the procedures being undertaken at each step in the admissions process. When necessary, these procedures should be reviewed for inmates transferred from within the system.

Written policy, procedure, and practice require the preparation of a summary admission report for all new admissions. The report includes at a minimum the following information:

- legal aspects of the case
- summary of criminal history, if any
- social history
- medical, dental, and mental health history
- occupational experience and interests
- educational status and interests
- vocational programming
- recreational preference and needs assessment
- psychological evaluation
- staff recommendations
- preinstitutional assessment information

Comment:

The summary admission report is the first document in the inmate's cumulative case record and identifies areas for follow-up. This document may be duplicated and used by the classification committee and other staff in developing the inmate's program.

Reception and Orientation

There is a program for inmates during the reception period.

Comment:

The daily program in the reception unit should include interviews, testing, and other admissions-related activities, including distribution of information on programs and services. New inmates should be provided reading materials, be permitted to attend religious services, receive exercise on the same schedule as the general population, and perform work assignments on the reception unit.

New Inmates

3-4275

Written policy, procedure, and practice provide that new inmates receive written orientation materials and/or translations in their own language. When a literacy problem exists, a staff member assists the inmate in understanding the material. Completion of orientation is documented by a statement signed and dated by the inmate.

Comment:

Orientation should include formal classes, distribution of written materials about the institution's programs, rules, and regulations, and discussion. Orientation should also be used to observe inmate behavior and to identify special problems.

ATTACHMENT A

GENERAL POLICY OF NONDISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF DISABILITY

It is the policy of the South Carolina Department of Corrections, its employees, agents, and contractors (collectively "SCDC"), that no otherwise qualified inmate with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of SCDC and its Institutions. Otherwise qualified inmates with disabilities, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act, as amended, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, are entitled to participate in any programs, services, and activities to the same extent as other similarly situated inmates without disabilities (i.e., subject to classification and other criteria that do not discriminate on the basis of disability). Similarly, SCDC prohibits retaliation, coercion, intimidation, threats, or interference with the exercise or enjoyment of rights of inmates with disabilities protected by law. Protected conduct includes but is not limited to requesting auxiliary aids and reasonable modifications in policies, practices, and procedures; filing grievances or filing complaints with the U.S. Department of Justice and assisting in the investigation of such grievances or complaints, and filing lawsuits under the Americans with Disabilities Act or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
