Dear Mr. Koola:

Please be advised that Rule 221(a) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR) states, in part: "No petition for rehearing shall be allowed from an order denying a petition for a writ of certiorari under Rule 242, SCACR." Therefore, no action will be taken on your petition for rehearing dated June 3, 2015.

I note that your petition for a writ of certiorari was considered by all of the members of the Court. In accordance with the Court's longstanding custom when it votes to deny certiorari, the Chief Justice signed the order on behalf of all of the members of the Court. In short, Rule 240(j), SCACR, which you have referenced, is simply inapplicable to this situation.
