ORDER

After issuing an opinion in this case, the South Carolina Court of Appeals granted a petition for rehearing filed by petitioner, and subsequently issued a revised opinion containing substantive changes from the earlier opinion. While a petition for rehearing has been filed regarding the revised opinion, no order has been issued on this petition for rehearing.¹

Petitioner now moves for an extension of time to serve and file the petition for a writ of certiorari. The request is denied as unnecessary since the time to serve and file a petition for a writ of certiorari will not begin to run until a ruling is made on the pending petition for rehearing. Rule 242(c) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules ("A decision of the Court of Appeals is not final for the purpose of review by the Supreme Court until the petition for rehearing or reinstatement has been acted on by the Court of Appeals. A petition for writ of certiorari shall be served on opposing counsel and filed with proof of service with the Clerk of the Court of Appeals and the Clerk of the Supreme Court within thirty (30) days after the petition for rehearing or reinstatement is finally decided by the Court of
