PETITION FOR REVIEW

OF ORDER TO EXCLUDE MATTERS ALLEDGED TO NOT BE PRESENTED TO THE LOWER COURT.

Appellant respectfully move to have the Motion revive/considered by this Court in an effort to receive a full and fair assessment of the claims initially filed in the lower court (ALC). 
I move this Court to act justly and render an assessment on the principles of that which is humanly right and lawfully applied.

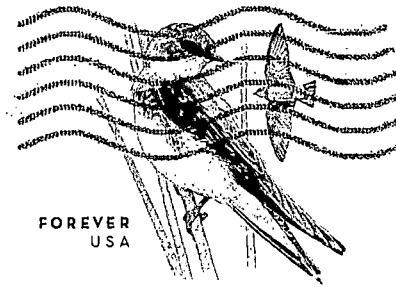
