This Court has received your motion under Rule 60(b) of the South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure (SCRCP). This motion seeks to set aside the decision of this Court denying the petition for a writ of certiorari in this case.


Please be advised that the SCRCP are inapplicable to this appellate case. *Cf.* Rule 81, SCRCP ("These rules, or any of them, shall apply to every *trial court* of civil jurisdiction within this state . . ."[emphasis added]); Rule 73, SCRCP ("Procedure on appeal to the South Carolina Supreme Court or the South Carolina Court of Appeals shall be in accordance with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules."). Instead, if you had any basis to challenge this Court's decision in this case, that challenge had to be raised by a timely petition for rehearing under Rule 221 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.

When no timely petition for rehearing was received by this Court, the remittitur was sent on December 30, 2014. The sending of the remittitur ended appellate jurisdiction over this case, and no further motions can be considered in this matter.

Therefore, no action will be taken on your motion by this Court.
