**APPELLANT'S SECOND MOTION FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME**

Pursuant to South Carolina Appellate Court Rule 263(b), Appellant Pankaj Patel, individually and derivatively on behalf of Nominal Defendant, VP Enterprises, Inc. ("Appellant"), moves for an extension of ten (10) days from the existing deadline to file his initial reply brief and designation of matter in this case.

Appellant served his Notice of Appeal on Respondents on January 23, 2015. Appellant moved on February 3, 2015 for a thirty (30) day extension, which this Court granted extending the deadline for serving and filing the Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter until March 25, 2015. Appellant moved on March 6, 2015 for a second motion for extension requesting an additional extension of thirty (30) days, which this Court granted extending the deadline for serving and filing Appellant's initial brief

and designation of matter until April 24, 2015. Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter were served on April 24, 2015, filed on April 27, 2015, thus the deadline for Respondents to file and serve their initial brief and designation of matter was May 24, 2015.

Respondents moved on May 19, 2015 for a thirty (30) day extension to file and serve their initial brief and designation of matter, which the Court granted extending the deadline for filing and serving their initial brief and designation of matter until June 25, 2015. Respondents moved on June 9, 2015 for a second extension requesting an additional thirty (30) days, which the Court granted extending the deadline for serving and filing their initial brief and designation of matter until July 27, 2015. Respondents served their initial brief and designation of matter on July 27, 2015.

Appellant moved on July 28, 2015 for a ten (10) day extension to file and serve his initial reply brief and designation of matter, which the Court granted extending the deadline for filing and serving his initial reply brief and designation of matter until August 17, 2015.

This is Appellant's second extension request to file his initial reply brief and designation of matter and is based on good cause and not intended for purposes of delay, nor will the requested extension prejudice the rights of any party.

If the ten (10) day extension is granted, Appellant's initial reply brief and designation of matter will be due by August 27, 2015. Appellant's counsel has conferred with counsel for Respondents regarding this motion, and they consent to the ten (10) day extension.

For the reasons set forth herein, Appellant requests a ten (10) day extension to August 27, 2015 to serve and file his initial reply brief and designation of matter.



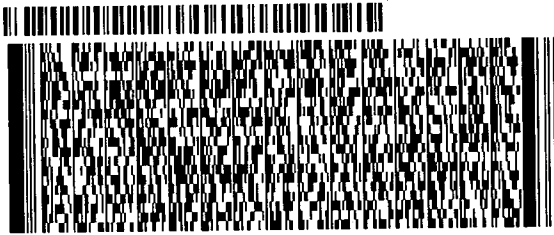

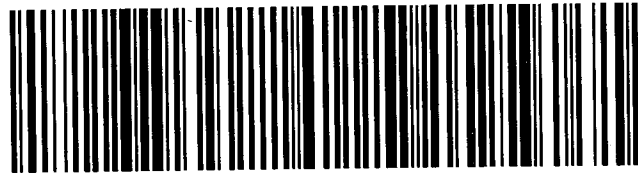
