


ORDER

By order dated August 4, 2015, petitioner's appeal from the denial of his fifth application for post-conviction relief (PCR) was dismissed based on petitioner's failure to provide proof of service on the Attorney General's Office. By way of letter to the Clerk of Court, which has been construed as a motion to reinstate, petitioner contends he did serve the notice of appeal on the Attorney General's Office. However, petitioner fails to state when it was served or provide proof it was served. Rule 203(b)(1), SCACR; Rule 243(b), SCACR; Rule 263(b), SCACR. Therefore, the motion to reinstate is denied.


Moreover, we hereby prohibit petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging petitioner's 2005 convictions for murder and possession of a weapon during the commission of a violent crime, or any motions in the underlying criminal case, including a motion pursuant to Rule 29, SCRCrimP, without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
