MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

---

Counsel for Chad Junior Bussell respectfully requests a **fourth and final** extension of thirty (30) **until October 16, 2015**, days in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel three previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Chad Junior Bussell respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. On September 10, 2015 counsel had an oral argument before this Court in the case of The State v. William Bolt. Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Rishawn Reeder v. The State with the Supreme Court on September 8, 2015. Counsel filed a return to petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in the case of Charles Ray Dean v. State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on September 8, 2015. On August 31, 2015, counsel had two hearings in the Circuit Court: a hearing in Orangeburg County before the Honorable Deadra L. Jefferson in State v. Tykeem May; and a hearing in Chesterfield County held before the Honorable Larry B. Hyman, Jr. in Noah Mumford v. State. Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jeffrey Riebe v. The State, with the Supreme Court on August 27, 2015. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Tyrone D. Ellison with this Court on August 25, 2015. Counsel filed a return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of The State v. Erick Arroyo with the Supreme Court on August 14, 2015. Counsel filed a petition for certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jeremiah Turner v. State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on August 13, 2015. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. James Allen Johnson on August 12, 2015 with this Court. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Brenda Gail Cutro v. State of South Carolina on August 12, 2015 with the Supreme Court. Counsel filed a petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. Sheldon Lamar Kelly on August 12, 2015 with this Court. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Quanell Marquan McIlwain with this Court on August 10, 2015. Counsel filed the final brief of appellant in the case of The State v. Jimmy Turner, with this Court on August 5, 2015. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. William Alexander with this Court on July 27, 2015. Counsel filed an initial brief of appellant in the case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Daquan Johnson to this Court on July 23, 2015. Counsel filed a petition for writ of

certiorari to the Court of Appeals in the case of The State v. John Edward Haynes with the Supreme Court on July 22, 2015. Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari in the case of The State v. Anthony Jackson with the United States Supreme Court on July 7, 2015.



5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.






