

Dear Mr. Powell:

I am in receipt of your request for the transcript in the above-referenced matter. An up-front deposit is required before I start producing your transcript. This deposit would be an estimate because I won't know how many pages it will be until the transcript has been completed. Currently the Supreme Court has set the page rate for production of original transcripts at \$3.25 per page. Once your deposit is received, then the transcript will be placed in line to be produced and packaged for mailing. The statutes which govern my job functions allow up to sixty days for this process to be completed. The 60-day time limit would begin once your deposit is received by me.

Upon review of the records, I would estimate your transcript to be approximately 40 pages, at a cost of \$135.05, which includes postage, at the normal 60-day turnaround rate. Deposits are to be paid by a postal money order or bank cashier's check, as I cannot accept personal checks. If you end up overpaying me, then I would refund the difference, via a money order or cashier's check back to you, of course. If, however, the deposit does not cover the entire cost of the transcript, I will contact you regarding what the difference will be, and any additional funds must be received before I can mail the transcript to you.

If you want me to proceed with the production of your transcript, please send me a postal money order or bank cashier's check in the amount of \$135.05, and I will be happy to proceed.
