ORDER

Based on the request of the petitioner, the time to serve and file the petition for a writ of certiorari and appendix in this matter is extended until October 26, 2015.¹ Pursuant to the order of the Supreme Court of South Carolina dated March 18, 2009 (www.sccourts.org/courtOrders/displayOrder.cfm?orderNo=2009-03-18-01), any further extension request must be based on a showing of good cause.

Petitioner is advised that the the petition and appendix must have the content specified by Rule 243(e) and (f) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), and these documents must be served and filed in the manner specified

¹ Petitioner's motion actually seeks an extension of time to file an initial brief. Since there are no initial briefs under Rule 243 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, this request has been construed as a request for an extension to serve and file the petition for a writ of certiorari and appendix.

It is clear that petitioner is not fully aware of the rules relating to this matter. This Court strongly encourages petitioner to obtain counsel to represent him in this matter. If he is not able to afford counsel, he should immediately complete the affidavit of indigency and submit that affidavit to the Division of Appellate Defense as indicated in this Court's letter of August 25, 2015. Petitioner is advised that he would benefit significantly by having counsel who is trained in the law represent him in this matter, and that if he continues to proceed without counsel in this matter, he will be expected to full comply with the rules of this Court.

by Rule 243(d), SCACR, including providing this Court with a proof of service for these documents. The petition, appendix and proof of service should be substantially in the format shown in Forms 19, 20 and 7, respectively, in Appendix C to Part II of the SCACR.
