1. The petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in this case are due to be served and filed today.


2. Counsel filed the petitions for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendices in Antonio Glover v. State and Darrell Goss v. State on July 23, 2012. On July 18, 2012, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Ricky New. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Jerry Goode in the Court of Appeals on July 16, 2012. The brief of respondent

in State v. Danny Cortez Brown was filed with the Court of Appeals on July 11, 2012. On Friday, September 7, 2012 counsel will file the petition for writ of certiorari in Marion Alexander Lindsay v. State, a capital case. Additionally, counsel suffered from an illness which prevented him from working during the early part of August.




