ORDER FROM THE APPEALS COURT

AND REPLY

On September 2, 2015, I, Brenda G. Harmon was granted the 'right', to be heard on case No. 2015-000061, in a court governed by my peers. I am asking the Court of Appeals to set a trial date for my case to be heard by the people. It appears to me, that the respondent is using tactics to stall for time. As for any request from Judge Benjamin, the Order that she gave was also given to the respondent. The respondent must also know that her decision was APPEALED and OVERTURNED, by higher Court, therefore the order from Judge Benjamin is voided.

It also appears to me, that the respondent once again trying to take away my 'right' that was given to me by the Appeals Court. I the Appellant, know who I am

and where I came from. I know my place in society as a being which governed me the same rights as any other nationality of people. I don't pretend to be who I am not. I have tried to live right by giving and helping others. I like for the respondent to show me a law, wrote by the assembly of government that he has the right to do major harm, brutal damage to another and not suffer the consequences. So what if my skin color is black. The respondent knowing that he did these atrocities to me, didn't even have the decency to say he was sorry, simply because I am a black female. I, the Appellant have suffered on a daily basis for (4), years and months, which the problem is chronic. The Appellant have started the procedure for surgery, however, there are steps that I must take before the surgery happens. I started he process, Friday, September 25, 2015, at MUSC Hospital in Charleston/Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina. Knowing that surgery won't cure me but hoping somehow it will ease the pains for me to have some kind of stability to living comfortable.

When the Appellant went before Judge Lee and was granted the right to be heard, the respondent chose not to show up, thinking no one would listened. But instead of dismissing the case, Judge Lee, looked and saw, asking for the defendant, having no-one to stand up. From what the Judge saw and the failure to appear, Judge Lee granted me the right to be heard.

It is time for this case to go before the people. The respondent can take black people's money but, cannot tell them he's sorry. He'll just get other Doctors in his field, to try and cover up his mess. I know it, and it is now time for the people to know it.

We are people, we must live by the same rules set before us. Otherwise, its not normal to act as if you are 'Above the Law.' It is my right to seek justice, which the Law says that I have.

I, the Appellant asked for \$2,000.000.00, in Compensatory damages and \$7,000.000.00, in punitive damages. I am asking the Courts to settle this dispute, set a date for trial, or grant a mediation hearing. Therefore I cannot be compel to give what I don't have. I wish that Joel E. Johnson could feel my pains.

What the respondent is asking from the Appellant holds the exclusionary rule, due to ongoing treatments, surgeries and medications for the rest of her life. Her mother lived until she was 92, years old and I, the Appellant pray for the same.
