Dear Ms. Reeves:

Upon reviewing your Appellant brief, the following deficiencies have been noted under the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), and any deficiency must be corrected within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter. Failure to serve and file an initial brief and designation of matter addressing these deficiencies may result in the dismissal of your appeal.

- According to Rule 208(b)(1)(A), (B), (C), (D), and (E), SCACR the Appellant's initial brief shall contain a statement of issues on appeal, a table of contents and cases, a statement of the case, an argument, and a conclusion. The document you filed does not include these items. Specifically, your brief does not include a table of contents or a statement of issues. Please refer to Form 13 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR for guidance.
- Rules 208(b)(8) and 267(a) require that the brief include a cover featuring the caption of the appeal. Please refer to Form 13 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR for guidance.
- A proof of service has not been provided. You must serve and file a proof of service for the initial brief and designation of matter substantially in the format shown by Form 7 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR.

• Rule 209 requires the designation of matter to list specifically what portions of the transcript(s), pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials you wish to be included in the record on appeal. This Rule also requires that the designation of matter include a certification signed by the party that the designation contains no matter which is irrelevant to the appeal. You have not provided a designation of matter that lists the items you wish to include in the record on appeal, nor does it include your certification. Please refer to Form 14 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR for guidance. We are returning the documents you attached to your brief in lieu of a designation of matter to you.
