
ORDER

Petitioners, who are not parties to this action, ask this Court to stay the sending of the remittitur, and thereby the finality of the Court's decision, in the matter. The South Carolina Appellate Court Rules do not allow a non-party to seek such relief. Rule 221, SCACR (only a timely petition for rehearing or petition for a writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals stays the remittitur); Rule 245, SCACR (*a party may seek the issuance of an extraordinary writ in the original jurisdiction of the Court*).
