

SURGERY

I, Brenda G. Harmon, the above named Appellant, gave notice to the courts on October 30, 2015, of my impending surgery that was performed on November 11, 2015, by Neuro-Surgeon, Sunil J. Patel, MD. Dr. Patel agreed with finding from Dr. Bahadori, of Charleston, South Carolina. Dr. Patel, is a doctor with an impeccable record in medicine. He is a teacher of medicine at MUSC, as well as an electorate speaker on Trigeminal neuralgia, his field of medicine around the state of South Carolina and other states.

I, the above named Appellant was cut behind the right ear, clipping the damaged nerves in the brain that controls the facial pains that I was having, and drilled on the back of the head on the left side, leaving hard bumps of scab, that has not left me on this day, which is Friday, December 4, 2015. I was also drilled in the front of the head, leaving two small scaled holes that is not as noticeable. However, the pain I was having at the time I decided to have surgery had increased from a rate of 4, 5, & 6, to the point 10+. It was then that I had no alternative but to have

surgery or die. Since the surgery, I have not had any of the pain the reasons why the surgery was done. It is an amazing feeling to wake up in the morning pain free. It is really amazing to have a day where's no pain at all. Then again, there are different problems that have occurred, like numbness on the right side of the face and the soreness of pain on the top of the right ear. These are minor systems compared to the erosion of damage that was done to me by the above named Respondent. The numbness, I am told will eventually go away in six months to one year. Then it could be permanent, still it is a very minor situation compared to the extreme pain that I was having.

I, the above named Appellant want to thank the Appellant Court, for the patience to continue with the proceeding of this case in light of my surgery.
