him. Brian & his girlfriend had spent most of  
the night at a friend's house they had a sick  
child. The police took Brian's phone and said  
that the # on his phone matched up to the  
# of an informant, so the phone was working.  
then in court they said the phone wasn't  
working. They could have gone to the phone  
company (and even if the phone so mysterious  
quit working) and got a ~~print~~ print out  
which would have proved Brian had nothing

to do with the Benjamin Singleton having meth  
in his back pack. The girl that was there  
they just sent her home. If Brian's atty  
had done what he should he should have  
asked for a copy of the text Brian  
sent the Singleton man before he was  
allowed to come to Brian's house. I  
stood outside and watched the police tear  
Brian's house apart all they got was a  
jar with roach kill in it which they never  
tested and the sink was stopped up so bad  
it was holding 6 inches of nasty water  
that I had tried to unstop. Someone had  
been pouring grease down the sink for a  
long time when I finally dug up the  
drain line that's what it was. I had use  
several types of drain cleaner. Since I  
own the property, why was the girl just  
let go, she was there as long as Brian  
was. The Singleton man has other meth  
charges against him so I have been told  
and tried to implicate Brian to help himself  
why can't someone get the phone and find  
out the truth about the meth. I have  
never heard any of Brian's friends say

that they have ever heard of Brian doing anything with meth. Brian is Bi-polar and has self medicated with pot and he admits that. What is so bad is to be Punished for something he didn't do. and I am quite sure the state is aware of the fact that Brian was not and never has been involved with meth. They have the evidence which was not presented

in court. I am Brian's grandmother and I am not trying to make a saint out of Brian. But the truth needs to be told by those in authority it can certainly cause people to loose faith in our system when you are punished for what you didn't do and no one tries to help.
