MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Henry J. Galloway respectfully requests a **final thirty (30) day extension, until February 29, 2016**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel two previous extensions.



On November 6, 2015, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Saire Castro v. State with this Court. On November 4, 2015, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. London A. Kelley with the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request as shown by signature below.
