"APPELLANT'S OBJECTION TO RESPONDENT'S FINAL BRIEF IN ITS ENTIRETY"


The Appellant received said Order January 12, 2016, and now make his objection, whereby the Respondent's Motion to Strike is clearly erroneous in view of the reliable, probative, and substantial evidence on the whole record, pursuant to Rules 209 and 210 SCACR, submits prejudice will result from exclusion/striking motion, and where order fail to point out any defect in support, would not afford Appellant a full and fair hearing.

In all actions, it is of vital importance not only to the parties involved, but to the court as well that parties quote properly and correctly pleading with truthfulness and not knowingly/intentionally misquote . . . or read into the other party's pleadings misrepresentation as outlined in "Appellant's Objection to Respondent's Final Brief in its Entirety", contrary to Rule 407 ACR, and Rule 11 SCRPC.

In determining whether evidence withheld by the State is material under "Discovery Rule" turn on whether cumulative effect of the withheld evidence resulted in reasonable probability that had the evidence been disclosed the result of the proceeding would have been different . . . the Question is whether the Appellant can receive a hearing resulting in a decision worthy of confidence, discovery material could prove critical to due process analysis, and whether an evidentiary hearing is required when complaint raised factual
