This responds to your correspondence dated February 10, 2016.


In the above appellate case, a document, which was received by this Court on January 6, 2016, was construed as a notice of appeal. This notice of appeal was dismissed by order dated January 19, 2016, since the appeal had been taken before a final order had been filed in this post-conviction relief (PCR) case. This dismissal was without prejudice to your ability to serve and file a new notice of appeal once a final order was entered with the clerk of the circuit court.¹ When no

¹ While the public case index for Williamsburg County now indicates that a final order was filed with the clerk of the circuit court on January 14, 2016, this Court has not received a new notice of appeal from this final order. If you wish to appeal from the final order in this PCR case, you will need to timely serve and file a notice of appeal in the manner specified by Rules 243 and Rules 203 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). To assist you in doing so, I have enclosed a sample notice of appeal and proof of service. Further, a copy of the

petition for rehearing was received within the time provided by Rule 221 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, the remittitur was sent to the circuit court February 4, 2016.

The sending of the remittitur ended appellate jurisdiction over this case. *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). Therefore, no action will be taken on your latest correspondence.
