MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Antwan J. Jett respectfully requests a **fourth and final** extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel three previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Antwan J. Jett respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



Counsel filed petition for writ of certiorari and the accompanying appendix in the case of Rodney Neals v. The State in the Supreme Court on January 20, 2016. Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in the case of The State v. Wayne Scott in the Supreme Court on January 14, 2016. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Quartis Hemingway in this Court on January 13, 2016. Counsel filed petition for writ of certiorari and the accompanying appendix in the case of Paul Richards v. The State in the Supreme Court on January 12, 2016. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Johnny Sexton in this Court on January 8, 2016. Counsel filed petition for writ of certiorari and the accompanying appendix in the case of Sugar Ray Robinson v. The State in the Supreme Court on January 4, 2016. Counsel filed petition for writ of certiorari and the accompanying appendix in the case of Robert Singletary v. The State in the Supreme Court on December 21, 2015. Counsel filed petition for writ of certiorari and the accompanying appendix in the case of Ronnie Harris v. The State in the Supreme Court on December 21, 2015. Counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Timothy Crosby in this Court on December 16, 2015.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.






