**FINAL ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

This matter comes before the Court by way of an application for post-conviction relief (PCR) filed December 19, 2013. The Respondent made its return on or about February 26, 2015 requesting the application be summarily dismissed based upon expiration of the statute of limitations and for failure to state a claim cognizable under the Post-Conviction Procedure Act.

Pursuant to this request, and after reviewing the pleadings in this matter and all of the records attached thereto, this Court issued a Conditional Order of Dismissal signed and filed March 3, 2015, provisionally denying and dismissing this action, while giving the Applicant 20 days from the date of service of said Order in which to show why the dismissal should not become final. Attached to this Final Order and incorporated herein by reference is a Certificate of Service dated March 6, 2015, serving the above-mentioned Conditional Order of Dismissal on the Applicant.

Applicant wrote a letter dated March 2, 2015 requesting an extension of time to reply to the conditional order. By letter dated March 10, 2015, Applicant argues that relief should be granted because the court lacked jurisdiction to impose the sentence, the sentence exceeded the maximum authorized by law, and that he did not knowingly waive his right to counsel.


This Court has reviewed Applicant's responses to the Conditional Order of Dismissal in their entirety, in conjunction with the original pleadings, and finds a sufficient reason has not been shown why the Conditional Order of Dismissal should not become final.

This Court notes Applicant pleaded guilty and was sentenced on April 12, 2001, and did not appeal his guilty plea or sentence. Because this action was filed on December 19, 2013, it was clearly filed outside of the expiration of the statute of limitations. See S.C. Code Ann. § 17-27-45(a).

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that for the reasons set forth in the Court's Conditional Order of Dismissal, the Application for post-conviction relief is hereby **DENIED AND DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**.

This Court hereby advises the Applicant that he must file and serve a Notice of Appeal within 30 days of the service of this Order to secure appellate review. See Rule 203, SCACR. Applicant's attention is directed to Rule 243, SCACR., for the procedures following the filing and service of the notice of appeal.

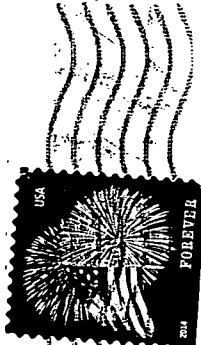

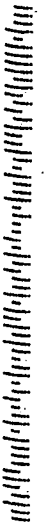
