MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for appellant respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days, **until April 4, 2016**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel two previous extensions.

2. Counsel for appellant respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously

granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



The State of South Carolina in the Supreme Court on January 13, 2016. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Curtis Nealey v. The State of South Carolina in the Supreme Court on December 29, 2015. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Tunzy Sanders v. State of South Carolina in the Supreme Court on December 21, 2015. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Russell Alan Tupper with the Court of Appeals on December 18, 2015. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Fredrick Martineze Pearson v. State of South Carolina in the Supreme Court on December 18, 2015. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Terrance D. Patterson v. State of South Carolina in the Supreme Court on December 14, 2015.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.


