
Dear Ms. Kitchings:

This law firm represents Founders Federal Credit Union, the appellant in the above-referenced appeal. Pursuant to South Carolina Appellate Rule 207, I am writing to advise you that I have yet to receive one of the necessary hearing transcripts that we initially requested from court reporter Aileen Butler on December 22, 2015. I spoke with Ms. Butler this week, and she is copied on this message as required by Rule 207. Ms. Butler asked for payment last week, and I have confirmed that Ms. Butler received the payment. Ms. Butler advised that she will provide us with the transcript within 60 days from the date she received payment. I informed Ms. Butler that Rule 207 requires the transcript be received within 60 days of the date we first requested it, December 22, 2015, rather than 60 days from the time she received payment.
