MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension **until April 18, 2016**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted

and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

On March 4, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in State v. Jherwaski Pressley with the Supreme Court. On February 17, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in State v. Henry Galloway with the Supreme Court. On February 17, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals and accompanying appendix in State v. Michael McCraw with the Supreme Court. On February 5, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Garron L. Norris v. State with the Supreme Court. On January 27, 2015 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Teron Jackson v. State with the Supreme Court. On January 25, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Makandi Terry v. State with the Supreme Court. On January 14, 2016 counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Antoine F. Chestnut v. State with the Supreme Court. On January 12, 2016 counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Leon Lilly with the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.




